## General Information – Related to All Shows

### Code of Conduct Statement

By making entries, all exhibitors and others associated with the entry, agree to abide by the following guidelines:

- Exhibitors shall at all times conduct themselves with honesty and good sportsmanship and reflect the highest standards of honor and dignity to promote the advancement of agricultural education.
- Animals shall not be administered drugs other than in strict accordance with applicable federal and state regulations and rules.
- Animals shall not be exhibited if the drugs administered in accordance with federal and state regulations and rules affect the animal's performance or appearance at the event.
- Exhibitors are required to present and care for animals in a humane and ethical manner.

***Failure to adhere to any rules shall result in the disqualification of the entry and exhibitor.***

**Exhibitor Eligibility:** The Michigan Junior Beef Show, Spartan Classic and Jackpot Hog Shows are open to all Michigan youth residents that have reached their 9th birthday and are not yet 21 by January 1, 2009. The Beef Showcase is open to all exhibitors that have reached their 9th birthday by January 1, 2009. The B&B Northern Exposure Club Lamb Show is open to youth exhibitors, 9 years of age and not yet 21, from Michigan and out-of-state. (All sheep from out of state must have health papers from their state of origin). Age for contests will be determined as of 1/1/09.

**Entry Deadline:** Entries for all events must be postmarked by May 26, 2009. Entries must be made by the exhibitor and mailed to Michigan State University, Dept. of Animal Science, 1287 Anthony Hall, E. Lansing, MI 48824. Please make checks payable to: Michigan State University.

**Late Entries:** Beef will be \$50 / head for each show (if late entering in both shows, fee is \$100.00 / head). Late entries for Spartan Classic will be \$15 / head plus the stall fee, and MSU B&B Northern Exposure will be \$25 / head.

Entry fees are non-refundable. Entries without payment or entries sent in with incorrect, incomplete or illegible information will not be accepted and will be returned to the exhibitor.

**Housing and Camping Accommodations:** There are several restaurants in close proximity. Concessions will also be available in the Pavilion. Camping spaces are available at a cost of \$10 per night. **Fans** will not be allowed in the aisles unless suspended overhead (**No fans on carts**). A maximum of one (1) fan per three head, owned by the same family or group requesting to be stalled together, will be permitted.

**Generators** are not allowed in or around the Pavilion. **Dogs Are Not** permitted in the Pavilion during these events.

**Tie-outs:** Space is available for night tie-outs for cattle.

**Bedding:** The preferred bedding is straw or wood chips. Both will be available for purchase at the site. Bedding is to be brought from home or is to be purchased from the official supplier to the Pavilion for Agriculture and Livestock Education.

**Junior Exhibitors:** Junior show exhibitors must show their own animal unless species chairpersons grant special permission. In the event that a substitute showperson is approved in any of the junior shows, that person must be a registered exhibitor in this show.

**\*All sheep and swine pens/stalls must be cleaned out before leaving the pavilion.**

The Pavilion for Agriculture and Livestock Education on the campus of Michigan State University is considered a classroom facility. As such, the use or possession of alcoholic beverages or smoking in the Pavilion is prohibited.

### General Rules

1. In order to exhibit in a specific breed for both the Junior Beef Show and the Beef Showcase, entries must conform to the following requirements for registration certificates:

In addition, all other breeds are welcome to participate in the **All Other Registered Breeds (AORB)** division. If, in the future, there are sufficient numbers of cattle entered within a specific breed not listed above, a separate breed show may be held. For heifers and steers that have a registration certificate but do not satisfy the criteria listed above, those cattle will show in the **AORB** division. In addition, classes will be available in the Junior Beef Show for crossbred and other steers that are not eligible for registering in a specific breed. In the Beef Showcase, some of the breed shows will include classes for steers. Please refer to the schedule on page 2 for a listing of those breeds. Any animal is eligible to enter and compete in only one breed regardless if animal is registered in more than one breed association registry.

2. **Grooming Regulations:** Use of false tail heads or adding of hair or hemp is prohibited. Coloring agents, except powders, may only be used on the legs and tail switch. No coloring agents may be used above the animal's flank. This includes colored show foams (black, red, etc.). Use of powders is prohibited. No forced administration of fluids to create gut fill will be allowed. Violation will result in the disqualification of the entry and/or exhibitor.

3. **Awards & premiums** will be issued to exhibitors.

4. **Ownership Deadlines:** Open beef show entries must be owned by the exhibitor by entry deadline. Junior entries must be solely owned by the exhibitor by May 1, 2009.

5. **Health Requirements:**

- Livestock infected with a communicable disease may not be brought to the show. To meet the health standards required to show, animals must be free of illness including clinical signs of respiratory disease (watery eyes, nasal discharge, elevated temperature, excessive slobbering, etc.), active ringworm or warts, and identifiable external parasites.
- Evidence of surgical, conformation or any other unethical alterations will result in the animal and exhibitor being disqualified from the competition.
- Official interstate health certificates are required for out-of-state beef cattle entered in the Beef Showcase and certificates must include test results that are required for exhibition in Michigan. For specific test requirements, contact the office of the State Veterinarian of Michigan at 517/373-1077.
- All livestock are subject to inspection by a licensed, accredited veterinarian anytime during the show.

## TB Test Requirements for Michigan Junior Beef Show and Beef Showcase

All cattle participating in the 2009 Michigan Junior Beef Show and Beef Showcase must be tagged with official electronic identification (RFID) tag approved by the Michigan Department of Agriculture.

**For Cattle in the Modified Accredited Zone** (Alcona, Alpena, Antrim, Charlevoix, Cheboygan, Crawford, Emmet, Montmorency, Oscoda, Otsego and Presque Isle counties): Must provide a movement permit and have had a whole herd test within the past 12 months. In addition, must provide proof that the individual animal was TB tested with negative results within 60 days prior to this show if the whole herd test was conducted 6 months prior to the show. No individual TB test is required if originating from an accredited TB free herd.

**For Cattle in the TB Free Zone** (Upper Peninsula): Must provide a movement permit. No TB tests are required.

**For Cattle in the Modified Accredited Advanced Zone** (all other counties in Michigan): Movement permit is not required and no additional TB tests are required for exhibition at this show.

**Procedure for exhibitors upon arrival to the MSU Pavilion:** All cattle will be inspected before any cattle are unloaded. The inspection will be done in the parking lot area directly to the west of the exhibition center. Exhibitors from the Modified Accredited Zone and Upper Peninsula must have movement permit available at this time. **Any cattle failing to meet these requirements will not be allowed to remain on the MSU Pavilion premise.** The show management and official veterinarians will make every effort to conduct this procedure in a prompt fashion.

## Michigan Junior Beef Show

Saturday, June 13, 2009

Judge: Lee Denzer, Kewanee, IL

1. Awards in the heifer show, steer show, showmanship, and all skills contests will include show equipment, embroidered travel bags, plaques, etc. Premiums will also be awarded.

### Breeding Heifers

1. Heifers born from September 1, 2007 thru March 31, 2009 are eligible to show.

2. All breeding heifers must be registered solely in the name of the youth exhibitor by May 1, 2009. Registration certificates for cattle entered in a specific breed must be presented at check-in time. Registration applications will not be accepted. Tattoos will be checked and must correspond to registration certificates.

### Market Heifers and Steers

1. Steers will be shown by breed. All steers entered in a specific breed must be registered solely in the name of the youth exhibitor with the respective national breed association. Registration certificates or performance pedigrees must be presented at check-in time. Registration applications will not be accepted. All breed steers must be tattooed and tattoos must correspond to registration papers. Classes will be available for crossbred and other steers that are not eligible for registering in a specific breed.

2. Steers entered in a breed division will abide by the guidelines for registry as established by their respective national breed association and as enforced by an official representative of the Michigan Junior Beef Show.

3. Market heifers will be shown by weight. Heifers shown in breeding classes may not be shown in market heifer classes.

4. This show will be judged as a preview-type show and cattle do not necessarily have to be ready for market.

### Beef Showmanship and Beef Skills Contests

1. There will be three age divisions: 9-12, 13-15, and 16-20 years of age (Age as of 1/1/09). No entry fee required for these contests.

### Beef Showmanship

1. Showmanship is open to all beef exhibitors at this show and will be held at the conclusion of the breeding heifer show. Please include exhibitor birth date on entry form.

### Beef Skillathon

1. Contestants will be evaluated on their ability to identify a variety of items related to beef cattle. These might include breeds, cuts of meat, feeds, equipment, parts of the animal, health, production, etc. It is suggested that contestants refer to the following for information to prepare for the event:

North Central Region Extension Beef Skills for Life Material: Available in your county Extension office

Retail and wholesale cuts of beef charts

Feed tags from your local grain elevator

### Beef Graphic Design Contest

1. Beef graphic design project should promote the beef industry, a specific breed, your junior organization or a similar topic.

2. Create a promotional flyer or brochure (8 ½ x 11). This contest will enable participants to use computer technology to design materials to educate the public about the beef industry or your organization.

3. Copyrighted characters such as cartoon characters can not be used.
4. The back of the design project should include the following information: name, address, phone number, birthdates, and resources.
5. Posters will be judged on the following areas: originality, message, attracts attention, use of space and design.
6. Graphic Design projects must be submitted to the designated area by 9:00 a.m. on Saturday, June 13, 2009. No entry fee is required.

#### Herdsman's Quiz

1. Contestants will be tested on their general knowledge of beef cattle. Categories will include: nutrition, management, health, reproduction, genetics, fitting and showing, selection, meat products, and others that pertain to beef production and promotion.

## Beef Showcase

### Sunday, June 14, 2009

#### Judge: Kyle Conley, Perkins, OK

1. All cattle will be weighed. Expected Progeny Difference (EPD) data, if available, from the respective breed associations will be supplied to the judge for their use in determining final placings.
2. Premiums will be awarded to exhibitors as a result of a grant from the Michigan Department of Agriculture.
3. **Each breed association will receive a 10' x 10' booth space for breed promotional material, at no charge.** Breeds that will be on display only should contact the events coordinator or beef committee chairpersons for details regarding entry of exhibit only animals.
4. Michigan State University staff will collect performance data and assist with each of the breed shows or exhibitions.
5. Exhibitors from out-of-state must be members of the respective Michigan breed association.
6. **Entries with incorrect, incomplete, or illegible information will not be accepted.**
7. Original registration papers must be presented at check-in time for all cattle including steers, if that breed is including a steer show in their breed show.
8. Several of the breeds are conducting special events as part of the Beef Showcase. These include:
  - Michigan Angus Association** - State Open and Junior Preview Show: Breeding cattle, steers, and junior showmanship
  - Michigan Chi Association** - State Open Show: Breeding cattle and steers
  - Maine Anjou Association of Michigan** - State Open Show: Breeding cattle and steers
  - Michigan Junior Simmental Association** - State Open Show and Futurity Show: Breeding cattle and steers
  - Michigan Shorthorn Association** - State Open Show: Breeding cattle and steers
  - Hereford/Polled Hereford and Limousin**, - Open Show: Breeding cattle and steers
9. Entries having tattoos that do not match the registration papers or are not legible will not be accepted.

**Attention junior Angus exhibitors:** The Michigan Angus Auxiliary will again be sponsoring a showmanship in conjunction with the Preview Show on Sunday, June 14<sup>th</sup>. There will be 4 divisions (junior, intermediate, senior and senior national). Contestants in the **SENIOR NATIONAL DIVISION** must meet all the requirements for the national contest to be eligible for this division. Copies of these rules will be posted at the show and are available from Barb Sweeney prior to the contest. Special attention should be paid to the following rules:

- (1) Contestants must be junior, life or regular members of the American Angus Association **PRIOR** to participating in their state contest.
- (2) Contestants must be Michigan residents and members of the Michigan Jr. Association.
- (3) Contestants must be at least 16 years of age by January 1, 2009, and not have had their 21st birthday before January 1, 2009. (Birth dates from January 1, 1988 through December 31, 1992.)
- (4) Any contestant who has participated in any of the previous national junior Angus showmanship contests is automatically ineligible for ensuing national showmanship competition.
- (5) To be eligible, each contestant must presently own registered Angus Cattle.
- (6) Youth who are interested in competing in this contest must register on or before **June 1<sup>st</sup>** by contacting Barb Sweeney and providing their American Angus Association member code.

10. The name and member code listed on the entry form as exhibitor must also be listed on the animal's registration certificate as "owner".
11. There will be open show classes for bulls born on or after January 1, 2007, heifers born on or after September 1, 2007 and cow/calf pairs. In the cow/calf classes, the calf must be the cow's most recent natural calf and must have been born on or after September 1, 2008. Cow/calf pairs will count as one entry fee unless the calf will also be shown in a class as an individual. In this case, two entry fees must be submitted.
12. Classes will be broken by age after all cattle are checked in. Every attempt will be made to follow the guidelines of the respective breed associations.
13. Ribbons will be presented by the Michigan Beef Showcase in each regular class. All other awards will be supplied by the respective breed associations.

## General Information

1. Entry Fee is \$15 per lamb if entered by May 26, 2009. Entry fee is \$25.00 per lamb after May 26 and will be accepted until day of show. Stall fee is \$11.00 per stall –unless paid with Saturday show entry.
2. **Premiums/Awards:** Grand Champion Lamb will receive \$150 cash and prize, Reserve Grand Champion Lamb will receive \$75 cash and prize. Lamb division champions will receive \$50 and Reserve division champions will receive \$30. Class premiums will be mailed after the show. Market lambs will show in three weight divisions.
3. There is no limit on the number of sheep entries per exhibitor, however; only two premiums will be paid per exhibitor per class. Awards or premiums will be presented in each of the contests.
4. **Sheep pens must be cleaned out before leaving the Pavilion. Exhibitors must use only pens that are assigned for use at the Michigan Junior Sheep Spectacular and Northern Exposure Lamb Show.**
5. **All sheep must remain inside the MSU Pavilion once they are checked in.**
6. **Sheep with visible prolapses will not be allowed to be exhibited.**
7. All market lambs must be slick shorn within 5 days prior to weigh in at this show.
8. No muzzles on lambs at any time.
9. Pens must be bedded with natural bedding (wood shavings, straw, etc.). No carpet.
10. Humane handling practices of sheep are required at all times.
11. No drench feeding of lambs. If drenching is necessary for the health of the animal, exhibitor must contact a sheep committee member.
12. In the show ring, after the sheep is set (or needs to be reset) and the exhibitor is bracing the lamb, the front feet must be on the ring surface.
13. **Health Requirements** - Sheep with clinical signs of infectious, contagious, or toxicological disease will not be permitted to show and should not be unloaded at the show site. In addition, because of the USDA requirements for inter and/or intrastate movement of sheep, the Michigan Junior Sheep Spectacular will require that all sheep (breeding stock and market lambs) must have official USDA Identification (ID) ear tags.

## Market Lambs

1. Classes will be determined by weight on day of show. Classes will be divided with approximately equal numbers per class. There will be three division champions and reserve champions. All Suffolk, Hampshire, Oxford, Shropshire, Natural Colored, and black-faced crossbreeds will show by weight in Division 1 through 3. All white face, speckles and other breeds will show by weight in Division 4 There will also be a division for "whiteface" market lambs if there are 4 or more whiteface lambs pre-entered in the show.
2. This show is open to out of state exhibitors. All out-of-state lambs must have health papers with respective State stamp.
3. All lambs entered in this show will be weighed in on Sunday morning.

## Jackpot Showmanship

1. Showmanship will immediately follow the selection of the Grand & Reserve Champion Market Lamb and will proceed from youngest to oldest.
2. Showmanship classes will be divided by age. Please include the exhibitor's birth date on the entry form. A \$5.00 fee will be collected at the gate. Payback 50% to 1<sup>st</sup> place, 30% to 2<sup>nd</sup> place and 20% to 3<sup>rd</sup> place in each age division.
3. Exhibitors must show their own animal. If exhibitors are late to their showmanship class, they will not be allowed to enter any remaining classes.

## Educational Contests

All youth may participate in the educational contests without exhibiting a lamb. All educational contests are separate from the contests held on Saturday. There will be three age divisions in each contest: 9-12, 13-15, and 16-20 years of age (Age as of 1/1/09). No entry fee is required.

## Skillathon

1. There will be a multiple choice test on general knowledge of sheep and the sheep industry. Topics may include, but are not limited to, nutrition, management, health, reproduction, genetics, fitting and showing, selection, and meat products

### Graphic Design

1. Contestants will be evaluated on their ability to identify a variety of items related to sheep. These might include breeds, cuts of meat, feeds, equipment, parts of the animal, health, production, etc.. Projects must be submitted by 9:00 a.m. on Sunday, June 14, 2009. Participants may use the same project for both graphic design contests but must be on the following topic: Sheep Industry Promotion (any topic of choice)

### Photography Contest

1. Contestants may submit one entry no smaller than 3x5 and no larger than 8 x 10. All entries must be matted, mounted or framed.  
2. The photograph should include sheep in some area of the foreground or background. Entries will be judged on the quality of the photograph, originality of shot/pose, and overall audience appeal.  
3. Photograph must be the work of the youth participant making entry. Digital photographs are accepted, however quality of the print will be evaluated. Please include your name and birth date on the back of the entry.

**Special Note:** Please plan to arrive on Friday evening or early Saturday morning. All hogs must be checked in by 9:00 a.m. Each exhibitor will be required to weigh their own pig on the official scales and turn in weigh cards at the office. The show will start in on time.

### Market and Preview Hog Show

1. Hogs will be shown by weight. Barrows or gilts are eligible. Prospect division will be for hogs weighing less than 220 lbs. Market division will be for hogs weighing 220 lbs. and above. The market weight hogs will be divided into 3 sections, light, medium and heavy weight. A champion and reserve champion will be selected in each weight section. An overall champion and reserve champion will be selected in both divisions (prospect and market). In the prospect division, classes will be divided into four divisions with a champion and reserve champion selected in each division.
2. Hogs will be checked-in and weighed when unloaded.
3. Hogs weighing 220 lbs. or more can either be sent to market or must return home. Transportation for hogs going to market will be arranged by the show officials, and exhibitors of hogs that go to market will be paid based on carcass value. **All exhibitors who are sending hogs to market must have completed a Pork Quality Assurance training and must provide PQA certification number or other verification of attendance.**
4. **Hogs do not need a pseudo rabies test.**
5. Please refer to the schedule for unloading times. Hogs are not to be penned until checked-in. Failure to adhere to these times will result in the hog(s) and exhibitor being disqualified.
6. Top two hogs in each class will be re-weighed for accuracy and must weigh within 10 pounds of reported weight. Any variance of more than 10 pounds will result in disqualification.
7. Premiums will be awarded and prorated according to the total number of hogs entered.
8. **Pens must be cleaned out before leaving the pavilion.**

**State Fair tags will be available.**

**(June 20, 2009 is the last day to tag pigs for the 2009 Michigan State Fair.)**

### Swine Showmanship and Swine Skills Contests

1. There will be three age divisions: 9-12, 13-15, and 16-20 years of age (Age as of 1/1/09). No entry fee required for these contests.

#### Swine Showmanship

1. Classes will be divided by age of exhibitors and awards will be given to the top 10 participants in each age division. Please include exhibitor's birthdates on entry card. Only youth that enter and exhibit their own animal in the show may participate. Youth must show their own animal in showmanship.

#### Pigathon

1. Youth can test their knowledge of the pork industry by participating in the swine pigathon. Topics may include management, nutrition, health and diseases, quality assurance, breed identification, live animal and carcass evaluation, and cuts of pork.

### Swine Graphic Design Contest

1. Swine graphic design topic: **Environmental Issues Effecting Swine Production**. The design project should identify a key issue and aid in educating the producers and consumers about the topic.
2. Create a flyer or brochure (8 ½ x 11) about Environmental Issues Effecting Swine Production. This contest will enable participants to use computer technology to design materials to educate the public about this topic.
3. Copyrighted characters such as cartoon characters can not be used.
4. The back of the design project should include the following information: name, address, phone number, birthdates, and resources.
5. Posters will be judged on the following areas: originality, message, attracts attention, use of space and design.
6. Design projects must be submitted to the designated area by 9:00 a.m. on Saturday, June 20, 2009.

### Special Overall Awards—Spartan Classic Junior Hog Show

The purpose of these special overall awards is to recognize youth that excel in several of the contests included in the Spartan Classic. Youth can compete in the live show, showmanship, graphic design and the pigathon contests of the swine show to be eligible. Special awards will be presented to top exhibitors.
